Dr Cameron Webb is a Hospital Scientist at NSW Pathology, Westmead Hospital, a Clinical Lecturer at the University of Sydney and Academic Leader (Research Education) for Westmead Clinical School. He is also a researcher within the Marie Bashir Institute for Infectious Diseases and Biosecurity and an Associate Investigator of the CRE for Protecting the Public against Emerging Infectious Diseases (CREID).











As a medical entomologist experienced in mosquito and mosquito-borne disease monitoring and management in coastal Australia, Cameron's work focusses on developing surveillance technologies for endemic and exotic mosquitoes and integrating mosquito management into urban and wetland design.

He is an experienced and skilled science communicator, with regular invitations to talk about mozzies and disease risk on national television and local radio (even a star spot on "The Checkout" in 2018), and in public lectures. He utilises social media for good, engaging with his many twitter followers and blogging on a regular basis to promote science, environmental health and ecological management to the broader public. Cameron is also a regular contributor to The Conversation.
